ASK A LAWYER

The attorneys at the Dedham law firm of Samuel, Sayward & Baler LLC will answer a question each month related to estate planning or elder law issues such as wills, trusts, probate, estates, Medicaid, or veteran's benefits. This month's question is:

- **Q.** I want to name my daughter as the executor of my Will but she is very busy with her children and her job and I'm worried that I will be putting too much of a burden on her. Could I say in my Will that she will be paid for serving as executor?
- **A.** You are right to be concerned, as the duties and responsibilities of serving as a Personal Representative (formerly called executor) can be extensive and time consuming. The good news is that Massachusetts law provides that your Personal Representative would be entitled to compensation whether or not you include such a provision in your Will. The amount of compensation to which a fiduciary (Personal Representative, Trustee, Conservator, etc.) is entitled is based on services actually rendered which benefit the estate at a rate of compensation commensurate with both the level of skill brought to the job and the level of skill required by the job. A Personal Representative will need to keep a record of the time spent on the various tasks undertaken in the settlement of the estate and will be entitled to be compensated for that time. The hourly rate of compensation depends in part upon the level of skill of the Personal Representative. For example, an attorney or CPA is likely to be entitled to a higher hourly rate than a nonprofessional. Sometimes family members who are serving as Personal Representatives are reluctant to take compensation for their services because they believe their siblings will be angry if they do so.

If you think this might be the case in your family, or if you think your daughter would be reluctant to accept pay for her service, then including a provision in your Will that you intend that she be compensated for serving as Personal Representative can be an easy way to make your wishes known to all of your children.


2004 PG-13 122 minutes
