ASK A LAWYER

The attorneys at the Dedham law firm of Samuel, Sayward & Baler LLC will answer a question each month related to estate planning or elder law issues. Please feel free to submit your questions anonymously by dropping them in the Ask A Lawyer box.

This month's question is:

Q. What are the advantages and disadvantages of purchasing our next home in our sons' names so that it will avoid probate at our death?

ASK A LAWYER (from previous column)

A. While avoiding probate is a desirable goal when doing estate planning, it is usually not a good idea to own property jointly with someone other than your spouse, or to have your assets titled in someone else's name. This is because if someone else's name is on your property, whether it's real estate or a bank account, that person is legally an owner of the asset. That means that he will have the same access to the asset as you do. While you may not be concerned that either of your sons would do anything to intentionally jeopardize the security of your property, you do need to be concerned about events beyond their control that could put that property at risk.

For example, if a child is in a car accident and a judgement is entered again him, the creditor may seek to enforce that judgement against your home if your home if you son is an owner. Similarly, if you're your child has money problems and defaults on a loan, runs up credit card debt he can't pay, has tax trouble, or file bankruptcy, your home is at risk if your son is an owner. Other events which could put your property at risk include a child's divorce, his disability, liabilities arising out of a business owned by your child, or your child's death.

Using a trust to hold title to property can be an excellent way to have property avoid probate and keep it free from the risks that joint ownership brings. However, everyone's situation is different. Determining how to take title to real estate is a decision which should be thoughtfully mde based on the totality of the situation after consultation with your attorney.






