## **Important Information for Retirees Turning 65**

The Town requires all Medicare-eligible retirees and their spouses who are insured with Town of Westwood/West Suburban Health Group to enroll in Medicare upon turning 65.

## Here's what you need to do:

1.) Contact Social Security Administration (SSA) approximately 3 months prior to your 65<sup>th</sup> birthday to enroll in Medicare Part A and B. (You may receive notification by mail from SSA prior to your 65<sup>th</sup> birthday.)

- 2.) Once you have enrolled in Medicare:
  - Contact Human Resources with a copy of your Medicare A and B cards.
  - Review and select a Town of Westwood Medicare Supplement Plan. Retiree health plan information can be obtained at the Human Resources Department in Town Hall or on our website at: <a href="http://www.townhall.westwood.ma.us/hr">www.townhall.westwood.ma.us/hr</a>, "Retiree Forms and Documents".
  - Work with Human Resources to finalize deductions from your pension check to include the discounted Medicare B rate. (The Town will reimburse 50% of your Medicare B cost.)
  - Your coverage will be effective on the first day of the month of your 65<sup>th</sup> birthday.
- 3.) What happens if your spouse is not 65?
  - If you and your spouse were on a family plan, you will go on Medicare and your spouse will remain on an individual plan until his/her 65<sup>th</sup> birthday.
  - Shortly before your spouse turns 65, he/she must contact Social Security and enroll in Medicare; once enrolled in Medicare, proceed by following the information outlined in Step 2 above.
- 4.) What happens if Social Security determines that you are not eligible for Medicare?
  - If Social Security determines that you are not eligible for Medicare, you must provide the Town of Westwood Human Resources Department with official proof of non-eligibility from Social Security.
  - If it is officially determined that you and your spouse are not eligible for Medicare, you may remain on a Rate Saver plan.
