I. OLD BUSINESS

A. TOWN UPDATE

Beth reported that the Town has been occupied with the following:

1. Assessing RFP

Two bidders Vision Appraisal and Patriot Properties were selected as finalists for the Assessing CAMA software package. They both made a presentation to the Board of Assessors in September. Based on the presentations and discussions with clients of each vendor, the group recommended Vision Appraisal. The IS department will send a letter to the Board of Assessors identifying our recommendation of Vision and requesting a written confirmation from the Assessors.

2. Payroll/Human Resources Processing Services

The IS department is coordinating the conversion of payroll functions from the current municipal software to Harpers Payroll Services.

3. Automatic Tax Payments

The IS department is investigating the possibility of automatic deductions of the quarterly tax bill from a taxpayers bank account.

4. Wireless Network

A wireless antenna was installed on the Islington Fire Station radio tower. Michael Oh from Tech Superpowers, Inc., presented a report identifying the street level testing performed, cost options and conclusion for a wireless network. This report included a map identifying areas with 100% wireless coverage, 70%, 30% or no coverage available. No additional equipment is needed in the 100% coverage area, however there would be equipment required for the 70% and 30% areas. This investment by the residents could be as much as \$350. There would also most probably be a monthly cost for a shared T1 line. The cooperative business model was also discussed with the potential for bandwidth theft. It was suggested that some form of user authentication may be required.

The Board agreed that in order to ask residents to make the initial investment in the wireless equipment, the town should be able to make a commitment to the wireless network for at least 12 months. Leon Barzin, Neil Fleming and Chris McKeown will prepare a summary of the wireless network which will be presented by Beth Ahern to the Selectmen at the next Selectmen's Meeting.

B. SCHOOLS UPDATE

1. Middle School Cable Issues

The INET cable to the Middle School was accidentally cut during the installation of the modulars. AT&T made a temporary fix but will have to return when the modular installation is complete.
