

Teen Study Nights were held on Monday, January 14th and Tuesday, January 15th, and we had a great turnout from both students and parents on the Westwood High School PTO who assisted as chaperones and served pizza and bagels. Now in its 5th year, the program has been very popular, and I want to particularly thank Megan Coppola and Sean Bevan for working with library staff to make these evenings happen. Several teachers spent the evenings working with the student groups as well.

The therapy dogs and their handlers continue to be the highlight of the evening! Thank you to Dog Bones for publicizing the event -- this year we had four therapy dogs: Zeus (American Mastif); Diego (Labradoodle); Yuki (in photos above); and Lila (golden retriever).

Book Club Kits: The Library now has four titles that circulate as "book club kits". Each kit contains 5 copies of the book (for distribution to members of the book clubs) as well as a book club discussion guide. Library staff are selecting newer publications which we think will be the most popular for book groups, and if this proves as popular as we hope, we will add additional titles in the coming months. Titles currently available are: **Becoming**, by Michelle Obama; **Educated** by Tara Westover; **Where the Crawdads Sing** by Delia Owens; **and Watching You** by Lisa Jewell.

ReadNext The ReadNext readers' advisory service has exceeded expectations. We have capped the program for now, with over 100 registered readers! Participants have indicated that they love getting their special picks every month, and the feedback has generally been extremely positive.

WiFi Access: In December we upgraded our WiFi speed from 50 to 150 mbps. And while the increased speed has made some difference in access to wifi, we are still looking into options which might increase our overall capacity (reducing the number of instances where people are unable to log in due to high demand) and eliminate the "dropped" sessions that some users experience.
