Programs and Services

New Museum Passes

Teen Experience at the Library – High School Mentoring Program to be implemented

For the past several months, library staff have been working on a variety of strategies to improve the teen and 'tween/patron/staff interaction in the library. Meetings were held in the fall with Middle School Vice Principal Kyle Grady, staff and Amy Rands (Library Trustee Chair) in an effort to coordinate efforts with the middle school. The library is an after-school destination for many middle and high school students, and on early release Wednesdays, the number increases exponentially. This fall we asked all of the students to sign in and out in an effort to have actual data about the influx of students. On average, we estimate that approximately 100 – 120 middle school students (predominantly 6th and 7th graders) come directly to the library after school on these early release days.

We are now working on another strategy in collaboration with Danielle Sutton and Sarah Baroud of Youth and Family Services to implement a High School Teen Mentoring Project – which we hope will be a model moving forward for working towards a better user experience for all of the patrons at the Library. We hope to have this in place by the first early release day in March. Will keep you all posted on results!

Staffing

Reclassification and Compensation Study completed

I would like to thank Joan Courtney Murray and Linda Unger for their work on behalf of the library staff. As a result of the study, the following changes have been approved by the Personnel Board:

Reclassification: Branch Librarian (L8) to Head of Branch Library Services (L10) – effective 1//1/17

Reclassification: Library Bookkeeper (L6) to Library Business Administrator (L8)--effective 1/1/17

Change in Hourly Rate for Substitute Librarian: Increase rate \$2 per hour – effective 1/1/17 Change in Hourly Rate for Substitute Library Assistant: Increase rate \$1 per hour – effective 1/1/17

Revisions to Library ATP Plan for FY18 --effective 7/1/17

- Grade L4 (Library Custodian)
- Grade L8 (Reference/Children's Librarian)

Ranges will shift as first step will drop off and a new step 10 will be added to the end of each of these two ranges. These were the two positions on the Library ATP Plan that were determined to be lower than median following compensation study undertaken by consultant.

When2Work Online Staff Scheduling- During the month of January, library staff transitioned to an online web-based scheduler that allows all staff to easily see who is working a particular shift, modify or "trade" shifts with department head approval, and add information about training, meetings or other activities in real time. Our Library Department Heads (Karen, June, Molly, Lizzy and Claire) worked together on creating departmental templates for all staff, and June Tulikangas organized two hands-on training sessions that walked staff through how to access the schedule (online and via the When2Work app), how to post available options, how to "trade shifts" and how to modify schedules. All staff now receive messages from their department heads to alert them to available shifts or to see who will be working on any particular day at any particular time. It was a bit of a challenge to make this transition, but everyone really worked together and I would like to thank all involved for putting so much extra effort and teamwork into making this possible.
