- Friday Morning Mysteries Bookgroup: A new monthly library staff-led mystery book discussion group created now an ongoing program.
- Staff Development: Massachusetts Library Association Conference in Hyannis, MA
 Six staff members were able to attend their very first professional conference!

Children's Services: On Thursday, October 5th and Thursday, October 12th -- 6th grade classes will walk to the Library in the morning with Cathy Bolger (Middle School Librarian), accompanied by Middle School teachers and several parents. The students will spend the morning at the library with different stations set up and staffed by the Westwood Librarians. Students are introduced to library resources, including print and digital collections, databases, the Teen Room, and have an opportunity to see first-hand how the sorter and self-check work. The morning visit concludes with a 15-20 minute book talk highlighting some new and interesting teen titles which are sure to be sought out later in the afternoon by some of the students. Special thanks to Lizzy McGovern for organizing this annual event.

Fall Storytimes are back up and running – and this year Lizzy is leading a teen reading group on early-release Wednesdays. This week 19 students participated in the group.

Islington Branch Library:

Activities are well underway for the fall including storytimes, MMO visits, Sit 'n Knit on Thursday mornings, and Legos.
