Programs and Collections

Summer Reading

- Summer Reading Programs will be drawing to a conclusion on Friday, September 8th. There were more than 1000 children registered which kept the staff in the Children's Room very busy! As of Wednesday (9/6) over 230 "Summer Reading Champion Lives Here" signs were earned! Participation in the Teen and Adult Summer Reading Programs also saw an increase as well this summer the "Patron Picks" displays created by Karen Gallagher and the Circulation Staff were very popular with adult readers (based on the frequent replenishment of the titles on display!)
- Winning raffles for Children and Adults on will be pulled on Monday September. When the winners come in to receive their prizes we will take pictures of them for the Facebook and newspaper.
- We had over 235 Summer Reading champions who won signs!

Teens and 'Tweens

- There has been a lot of interest in the new VolunTeen program which Lizzy is coordinating. The program begins on October 4th and she has had several completed applications turned in already.
- The Teen Mentor program will re-start on September 19th -- with an orientation for the students who have volunteered to be teen mentors. I do not know yet how many applicants we will have – but we are collaborating with Youth and Family Services and hope to have lots of interested students participate.

 Lizzy has finalized dates with Cathy Bolger for 6th grade visits: they take place at the library on Oct 5th and 12th from 8:30-10:30am.

Book Clubs

- YA for Adults Book Club: Lizzy has had a lot of interest from parents and other adults about this group. The first book is *One of Us is Lying*. Discussions will be held once a month at Chiara.
- Karen Gallagher has been doing a lot of community outreach. She is working with several local book groups and book clubs to coordinate obtaining advance copies of the titles they select. In addition, she has also taken on a leading role in facilitating a new book group which meets once a month at the Highland Glens.

Solar Eclipse Community Event

 The "Great American Solar Eclipse" event was very successful – thank you to so many town departments who collaborated to make this event happen, including the COA, Rec Department, DPW (Harry Mikitarian was a huge help) and Fire and Police personnel.
