STRATEGIC PLAN: WESTWOOD PUBLIC LIBRARY IS PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE!

We are well on our way in terms of the planning process for our strategic planning initiative. Two focus groups were held last week. On Tuesday evening, 4/26 the Library hosted the Community Focus Group. There were 28 participants from the community and they really did an incredible job! On Thursday, 4/28, the Library staff met as a focus group as well.

I expect to have a draft of the plan ready for review by the Trustees by July/August. The deadline for submittal to the MBLC is October 1st. We will be following up with the members of the Community Focus Group as well to ask for their input once the written draft is complete.

RESOURCES AND COLLECTIONS

One of the most highly used sections of the Library's Collections is the travel section. Efforts are currently underway by the Reference Staff to conduct a thorough analysis of the collection and identify areas for updating. This project is being overseen by our Adult Services Librarian, Molly Riportella.

PROGRAMMING

School Visits – beginning in the next few weeks, our Children's Department staff will begin their annual classroom visits. Visits will be conducted at all of the elementary schools and will also include several day care visits as well. Participating are Lizzy McGovern, Head of Children's Services, Hannah Gavalis, Karen Cagan, Suzie Canale and Jenny Durant.

Summer Reading Programming is being finalized. In addition to the Children's Summer Reading initiatives, this year the Library will also be highlighting Young Adult and Adult Summer Reading Programs. Additional details will be available soon!

Exam Study Week – looking forward to another Final Exam Study period. Will be coordinating efforts with Principal Sean Bevan and High School PTO. Dates proposed for Teen Study Nights: Wednesday 6/19; Thursday 6/16; Monday 6/20.

MUSEUM PASSES: The warm weather is here, and it's a great opportunity to explore using the Museum and Destination Passes available at the Westwood Public Library. Pawtucket Red Sox, Boston Harbor Cruises, Museums and Zoos are just a few of the options. <u>New in 2016 is the Mass Parks Pass</u>, which allows free day parking at over 50 facilities in the Massachusetts State Parks System that charge a day-use parking fee. Locations include Horseneck Beach; Hopkinton State Park (think canoes, paddleboards, kayaks and swimming); Nantasket Beach; Borderland State Park and many other locations. STAFFING:

Library staff is currently working on developing updated job descriptions in preparation for a Library Re-Classification Study. This work is being done with the support of the Town's Human Resources Department – and Linda Unger and Joan Courtney Murray are working closely with the staff as we move forward. The last reclassification was done in 2004; and many of the responsibilities and duties have changed since that time.

Position Vacancy: Nancy Weinrich has given notice that she will be resigning her position as a Part-Time Reference Librarian in order to be able to devote more time and energy to her full-time job. Nancy has worked here in Westwood for several years on Wednesday evenings, and it has been a pleasure and a privilege to have had her as a member of our staff. The Board of Selectmen approved our request to post and fill this position at their meeting on May 2nd.

A by-law review committee was established, and under the direction of Sue Burgess, revisions to the bylaws have been proposed. SENIOR INDEPENDENT PROJECT PROGRAM – SIPP

This past year I have been working with Ilana Goldberg on her Senior Independent Project Program. This program offers High School Seniors an opportunity to create a project around a passion outside of the school curriculum. Students must apply for, interview for, and be accepted into the program during their junior year. This year the course had 36 students. Ilana approached us last May with an interest in developing a program related to reading and literacy. For the past year, I have worked with Ilana as her project mentor. Her project was the creation of a reading group for teens – which she titled the "JUST FOR FUN TEEN BOOK GROUP". Lizzy McGovern, Hannah Gavalis, Molly Riportella and Teresa Kerrigan also worked with Ilana and provided encouragement, information and feedback.

Ilana has a tremendous work ethic, and took her role very seriously. She worked hard to prepare for the project, and continued to make adjustments during the course of the year to improve the experience for those participating, and to reach out to generate more interest and involvement. I hope that we will be able to build on her success and continue the book group moving forward. Ilana is headed off to Marist College in the fall, and I know that she will do great things there as well!
