

FY21 Capital Budget Review

- FY21-FY25 Five year Capital Budget document produced
 - Highlights capital project requests for a 5 year period.
- Capital Budget Includes 3 Categories:
 - Ongoing, recurring capital:
 - DPW vehicles and equipment
 - Police vehicles and safety equipment
 - Fire vehicles and safety equipment
 - Non Recurring projects
 - Examples:
 - Turf Field replacement
 - Road Bonds
 - Town wide recreation projects
 - Larger new building or renovation projects

- Council on Aging vans
- School and Municipal IT equipment
- School and Municipal building maintenance



FY21 Capital Budget Review

Continued Review of non recurring projects (some from Spring 2019 Review)

- Recreation: Director Nicole Banks
 - Field Lighting Project (Thurston site)
 - Tennis Court Repurposing (Sheehan site)
 - Options for property behind High School tennis courts
 - Pool projects
 - Deck resurfacing replacement
 - Draining and refurbishment

 The Town has steadily reinvested in significant capital reserves in major building projects, both new buildings and renovations.




 These updated facilities provide modern and safe buildings for our residents and enhances the operations of departments and delivery of services.

 The timing of building projects can depend on need, scheduling of debt financing, and outside funding, including MSBA funding, library grants, etc.



Previously completed projects:

- Schools
 - Martha Jones Renovation/Expansion
 - Approved in 2000, \$7.2M
 - Downey School Renovation/Expansion
 - Approved 1999, \$6.5M
 - High School New Building
 - Approved 2000, \$44.2M



- All of these projects received approximately 59% of funding from the MSBA.
- All funded with long term bond, and voted as debt exemption
 - Middle School Modulars/Expansion
 - Approved 2009, \$3.5M
 - Funded with long term bond

Previously completed projects:

- Town Buildings
 - Library
 - Approved 2010, Total cost \$13.3M
 - Received State Library grant of \$4M
 - Town share of \$9.3M funded with long term debt.



- Islington Fire Station
 - Approved 2015, \$8.65M
 - Funded with long term debt
 - Project timed to accommodate additional staff/equipment needed to service University Station
- Police Headquarters
 - Approved 2016, \$13.2M
 - Funded with long term debt



There are additional buildings that will require renovation/expansion/new build. The timing of the projects will be based on current need assessments, financing opportunities and coordination with other projects.

Upcoming projects under consideration:

In Process:

- Schools Elementary Building Project
 - Hanlon, Deerfield, Sheehan
 - MSBA funding available for components of the overall need.

Future projects needed:

- Town Hall Renovation
- Senior Center Expansion
- Fire Station 1

- DPW Facility
- Sewer Facility
- Recreation/Community Center
