PROTECT YOURSELF FROM SCAMS DURING THE CORONAVIRUS

PROTECT YOURSELF FROM SCAMS DURING COVID-19

The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) reported that in just the first nine days of April, they had received complaints of losses due to Coronavirus scams totaling \$7 million dollars.

Here are some ways to protect yourself:

1.Beware of bogus medical alerts: A text message or email telling you that you've been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or that you must take a test.

2. Never give out your Social Security or credit card numbers or your bank information, and do not click on any links as they may download malware onto your device. Legitimate contact tracing texts will not contain any links and legitimate calls will never ask you for any personal information or money.

- 3. You can confirm with the town's Public Health Dept. that a coronavirus testing site is legitimate.
- 4. When online do not click on links without first confirming they are legitimate.

5. Know that you can't trust your Caller ID as criminals are able to "spoof" phone numbers and manipulate your caller ID to have it appear as if it is legitimate when it is not.

6. If someone calls and you're not sure if it is legitimate, hang up and call the business directly.

7. There are companies marketing phony cures and treatments for the coronavirus. Ask your physician about the effectiveness of these products before you buy them. The best places to get reliable information are the World Health Organization and Centers for Disease Control.

8. Before you donate to a charity you can check <u>www.charitynavigator.org</u> or call the state's Attorney

General's Charity Division at **617-727-2200** to make sure the charity is legitimate and to see how much of your donation goes to the charity's programs.

9. The FTC recommends paying for purchases with a credit card. The maximum liability for unauthorized credit card charges under federal law is \$50.

10. Scammers are the only ones who will ask you to pay with gift cards. Never wire money to someone you don't know.

Also:

1. To reduce sales calls, register your home and mobile phone numbers for free on the **Do Not Call Registry** at <u>www.donotcall.gov</u>. You will get an email with a link you need to click on within 72 hours to complete your registration. You may also register by calling **1-888-382-1222** from the phone you want to register. Your registration will never expire.

2. Check your credit report. Through April 2021, everyone is eligible to get free weekly *online* credit reports from Equifax, Experian, and Transunion. To get your free reports, go to <u>www.annualcreditreport.com</u>. You can still get a free report by phone at **1-877-322-8228** or by mail once every 12 months from each of the three companies above.

3.You can stay up-to-date on the latest scams at <u>www.scamicide.com</u>. You can receive daily emails with the Scam of the Day by going to the bottom of the page and clicking on the tab that says, "Sign up for this blog." Also, check out the Better Business Bureau's tips at <u>www.bbb.org/scamtips</u>.

Stay well and stay safe!

We encourage you, especially during this coronavirus pandemic, to take this advice -

Be kind to yourself and keep reaching out to others to stay connected.

You can stay safe and stay connected.


TRAVEL WITH THE SENIOR CENTER



AARP TAX HELP

As you may have already heard, the federal government has extended the tax deadline to July 15, which means that you will not face interest or penalties for not paying on time. Massachusetts state taxes are also extended

until July 15.

AARP has cancelled all of their Tax Assistance. *As of today, AARP is recommending that people find a private tax company.* At this time AARP does not have a plan for additional dates, however, this may change as things improve. To check if any changes have been made to the AARP Tax Assistance program, please call AARP at 888-687-2277, once the recording starts, simply say "Representative" and this should bypass the recorded menu. *Please call them directly.*

NOTES FROM DOTTIE— **TOWN CLERK 2020 CENSUS**

If you receive any telephone call re: a card that has just been mailed to all households regarding completing the census, this is legitimate. This is the roll out of the 2020 federal census. There is a unique ID number on this invitation which allows the recipient to

go online and complete the questionnaire . This is a safe and secure site and all information is



confidential and only used for statistical purposes.

For those who are not comfortable or who have no access to the internet, a paper copy will be mailed in the upcoming weeks.

3/12-3/20-An invita-



tion to respond online (2020census.gov) to

the 2020 census will be mailed to every household; 95% will also receive a paper questionnaire.

April 1, 2020-National Census Day.

4/20-4/27-A final reminder postcard before Census bureau follows up in person.

6/2020-7/2020-census takers will go door to door to count people who have not responded to the 2020 census. They will provide proof that they are official government personnel. (This is still tentative due to the present health crisis).

12/31/2020- The census bureau reports to the President, the population count and apportionment of seats in the US House of Representatives to each state.
