WE ARE IN THIS TOGETHER

The Westwood Senior Center will continue to be closed through the fall due to the pandemic ... staff is still here in the office daily from 8-1 or working remotely when not in the office. We stay closed to keep you, our staff and the town at large safe. In an effort to keep everyone connected and active, we continue to offer remote programming, Meals on Wheels as well as outreach services daily.

As of this writing, we now offer most of our regular programs either on cable or on Zoom. And since we can no longer offer "lunch and learns", starting in September we will be adding "special programming" on your local cable station. These will include conversations with MetroWest Legal (discussion on health proxies), Big Y Pharmacy (discussion on COVID 19), Dedham Savings (discussion on scams), Social Security (updates) and the Audubon Society (discussion on bird watching) to mention a few; more to come in the fall. And don't forget a recorded monthly PSA (Public Service Announcement) is available daily to keep everyone abreast as to what is happening at the Center.

We are also starting to transport seniors (in a very limited way) for grocery shopping and medical appointments. See inside for details.

If you are feeling stressed out, or just would like to be in touch with someone new, we could easily add you to our weekly check—in call (with one of our COA Board members) or connect you with a Westwood student (pen pal program). See inside for details. Of course, if you need help with fuel assistance, or if you feel food insecure, please get in touch with Karen ...she is here to help.

<u>Finally, please remember to fill out your **CENSUS** ...it is imperative that everyone get <u>counted</u>. If you need assistance filling out the forms, please call us and we can help you.</u>

Most importantly, please follow what science advises throughout this pandemic as it is not going away soon, whether we want to believe it or not; don't panic, but be prepared for anything the future might hold. We may be closed to the public, but we are still here helping Westwood seniors daily.

Remember to stay connected with your family, friends and neighbors. We miss you and hope you are staying safe.

Medicare Open Enrollment

That time of year is approaching again...the **Medicare Open Enrollment Period**. It runs each year from **October 15 to December 7** and allows you to change from your current Medicare coverage to another plan. Plans change every year so it's important to review your coverage to make sure you have the coverage you need at a cost you can afford.

Our certified **SHINE** ("Serving Health Insurance Needs of Everyone") counselor Mitch can help you compare the costs and benefits of Medicare and other health insurance options and help you enroll in a health insurance program that best fits your needs. SHINE counseling is a **FREE** service, and **Mitch** is a volunteer who has no affiliation with insurance companies. Please call the Center if you'd like to *schedule a phone appointment* with Mitch. *At your scheduled appointment time you will need to have with you all your medical cards (Medicare, Supplemental Insurance, and Prescription Cards) and medication bottles (or a list of your current medications, dosages, and frequencies). <i>Note: There will be no in-house appointments at the Senior Center.*



Transportation with Trish



Important Information from the Westwood Town Clerk Regarding the upcoming State Primary to be held on September 1, 2020

<u>VOTER REGISTRATION</u> -The deadline to *register* to vote for the September 1, 2020 State Primary will be on Saturday, August 22, 2020.

If you are not able to *register online* please contact Town Clerks office *by telephone:781-326-3964 or via email: <u>town-clerk@townhall.westwood.ma.us</u> and we will send you and Voter Registration form. In-person registration will be offered from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. on the last day to register or change party enrollment, Saturday, August 22, 2020 at Town Hall, practicing all social distancing guidelines.*

EARLY VOTE BY MAIL _- In July, a new law was passed to allow all registered voters in Massachusetts to (Early) vote by mail in any 2020 election, with no excuse needed. As required by the new law, an (Early) Vote by Mail application was mailed by the Secretary of State to every person who was registered to vote on or before July 1, 2020 and who had not already requested an Absentee ballot for the State Primary or for all elections this year. A second mailing will be sent out in September to all voters who have not already applied for a (Early) Vote by Mail ballot for the November election. The applications are pre-addressed to your local election official (Westwood Town Clerk) and no postage is necessary. (Early) Vote by Mail applications must be delivered to your local election office (Westwood Town Clerk) no later than 4 business days before the election. For the State Primary ballot, your application must reach The Westwood Town Clerks office no later than August 26, 2020. If you wish to (Early) Vote by Mail, you are strongly encouraged to return your application as early as possible, to make sure that you will receive your ballot in time to return it and have it be counted. If you do not receive an (Early) Vote by Mail application they are available in front of the Westwood police station lobby or you may contact the Westwood Town Clerk by telephone: 781-326-3964 or email: votebymail@townhall.westwood.ma.us and one will be sent to you. Applications for mail-in ballots are acceptable if they are submitted by US Postal Mail, Email:votebymail@townhall.westwood.ma.us or Fax:781-948-,4573 provided the signature is visible and it is signed in substantially the same manner as a handwritten signature. This includes applications signed with a mouse, stylus, or finger. Applications with typed signatures are not acceptable.

EARLY VOTING IN PERSON: August 20-August 28, 2020 - Will be conducted in the Jaillet Meeting room at the Westwood Police Station, 588 High Street. Hours will be as follows: Saturday and Sunday August 22 & 23 -9:00AM-1:00PM; Monday, August 24-9:00AM-4:00PM; Tuesday, August 25-9:00AM-7:00PM; Wednesday, August 26-9:00AM-4:00PM; Thursday, August 27-9:00AM-4:00PM; Friday, August 28-9:00AM-1:00PM.

<u>MAILING BALLOTS</u> - Early & Absentee Ballots have been mailed to registered voters who have submitted an <u>(Early) vote by mail application</u> or an <u>Absentee Ballot application</u> to the Westwood Town Clerk's Office.

This is a Primary therefore those voters registered in a party will only receive those party ballots for which they are registered and those voters who are unenrolled (formerly referred to as independent) have to specify what party ballot they wish to receive on their application otherwise a ballot will not be sent. The mailing will include a ballot, instructions, $\underline{AV7}$ or $\underline{EV7}$ envelope to place your cast ballot in, sealed and signed by the voter, and a postage pre-paid, pre addressed envelope($\underline{AV8}$) to return your ballot in. Your ballot can be mailed, or dropped off in a secure ballot drop box which is located in the lobby of the Westwood Police Station, 588 High Street. Ballots need to be returned by 8 p.m. on September 1st in order to be counted. Any voter who has returned an early or absentee ballot that has been accepted cannot vote in person on Election Day.

During the month of July, Westwood patrons retrieved over 1000 curbside pick-ups, and the demand continues to grow. Curbside Pickup will continue to be available as we move forward with planning and policies for a phased re-opening of the Main Library facility. "Next Steps" have been identified and staff are working with the town and other agencies to develop plans and procedures that will allow us to provide expanded services and resources as we move into the fall season. At this time, we have also expanded services that are available to those individuals who cannot travel to the library due to illness or injury with our **Homebound Delivery** program for Westwood residents.

FAQs -- Homebound Delivery

Who is eligible to take advantage of this program?

Westwood residents who are confined to their homes due to illness or injury, either temporary or long term, and are therefore unable to travel to the library, may register for this service. You must be a Westwood resident and have a valid Minuteman Library card.

What type of materials can I borrow?

All circulating library materials, including books, magazines, audiobooks, dvds, and music cds will be delivered for a three-week loan period. Materials will typically be delivered and retrieved on the same day. We can select items for you by title or author, or if you prefer, library staff will select a variety of materials based on your reading interests and preferences. Library staff will be happy to take your call at 781-320-1081 to set up Homebound Delivery — with library materials delivered to your door!

If you would like additional assistance or would like to learn more about Homebound Delivery, please give us a call! We look forward to welcoming patrons back into the facility at some point in the coming months; in the interim, we invite you to give us a call and hope that you will be able to take advantage of some of the programs and services currently available.
