Westwood Launches New Alert Notification System

ALERT Westwood powered by Smart911is the Town of Westwood's official emergency alert and notification system. This system is used to send notifications to the public. ALERT Westwood powered by Smart911 is a free service that allows you to sign up online to receive customized alerts via text message, email, and voice message. In addition to emergency alerts, you can also choose to receive customizable community notifications. These include notifications about severe weather, safety, health, utility disruptions, major traffic incidents, and more. This service is provided by the Town of Westwood at no cost to the public; however, message and data rates may apply.

Why should I sign-up for ALERT Westwood powered by Smart911?

When emergencies happen, be the first to know. The Town of Westwood uses ALERT Westwood powered by Smart911 to send official, real-time alerts to the public with information about potentially life-saving actions they may need to take to keep themselves and their families safe. By signing up for ALERT Westwood powered by Smart911, you are taking a large step toward improving your personal safety.

How does it work?

When an emergency occurs that meets the criteria for sending out an alert to the public, the Town Administrator's office will gather the necessary information and push out an alert to the affected area. Alerts can be sent out townwide to everyone who has opted-in to the system, or to a specific area or neighborhood for more localized events.

Westwood Writes: An Intergenerational Pen Pal Program



Get Connected to a Therapist Over the Phone with the INTERFACE Referral

The William James College **INTERFACE Referral Service** is free for Westwood residents of any age at any time, but during this COVID-19 public health crisis they are able to connect residents with therapists who can conduct sessions over phone or video to address anxiety, depression, grief and loss or any other mental health concerns.

When you call the INTERFACE Referral Service, a representative will ask you about your specific needs and insurance. After the initial phone call you will receive a follow-up call from INTERFACE with contact information for a mental health professional who meets all your needs and is available to begin meeting with via phone or video while social distancing is in place.

It is also important to note that at this time the Commonwealth has mandated insurance companies to waive copays for mental health phone and video sessions that are related to COVID-19.

Westwood Youth & Family Services - Fall 2020 Update

Westwood Youth & Family Services has been supporting and advocating for the children and families in our community since 1986. We are a municipally funded agency providing clinical and supportive services designed to foster the healthy growth of children ages 4-18.

During the COVID-19 public health crisis the Y&FS department continues to provide remote counseling services and community programs to residents at no cost. This summer, in partnership with the Westwood Public Library, we held two well-attended weekly sessions of a virtual Creative Craft Club with themes that supported mental health and well-being for children in first through sixth grades.

In fall of 2020 we will continue to run as many of our programs as possible within current safety guidelines. Our popular *Friends Network* program will take place, with a hybrid model of in-person and remote sessions, and other Mentor programs will also be available to school-aged residents. We are looking forward to launching new and innovative programs that meet the evolving needs of youth and families during this time. One such program that will begin this fall, in partnership with the Council on Aging, is *Westwood Writes: An Intergenerational Pen Pal Program*, connecting Westwood High School students and Senior Citizens.


The Youth & Family Services Department and our Advisory Board are happy to introduce our Graduate Interns, who will be with us for the 2020-2021 school year.

Recognize A Youth (R.A.Y.) Award

The Rotary Club of Westwood and Westwood Youth & Family Services (WY&FS) proudly announce the recipients of the 2020 Recognize A Youth (R.A.Y.) Award. Four Westwood students will be honored this September at a ceremony held outside the Westwood Town Hall. The recipients, through their actions, have demonstrated an ethic of caring for others that is essential for the health of our community. This year's honorees are Laurel Barnett, Ruby Fyfee, Pragna Lal and Roisin O'Keeffe.

Laurel Barnett is a senior at Westwood High School. She was nominated by Lina De Arena-DeRosa, the Director of the Westwood Council on Aging (COA). When Laurel was a freshman she reached out to the COA about sharing her musical talents with Westwood seniors. She organized Music Matters, a small group of talented musicians and for the last few years they have played regularly at many COA luncheons. In her nomination Lina noted, "Laurel is a gem, a one in a million, talented, unassuming, a kind and giving student who has always been dependable, creative and willing to make Westwood seniors feel loved. She has coordinated all the events with little to no direction and is so very easy to work with. She is continually coming up with new and novel ways to bring music to the Westwood elder population." When the COA closed for programming due to the COVID-19 crisis, Laurel made sure the program continued online by putting together a YouTube Channel featuring Tri-M Music Honor students sharing their music for all residents. Laurel is a member of Girls Scouts and recently received her Gold Award. At the high school she is a member of the Tri-M Music Honor Society, track team, and the Westwood Site Council along with other clubs and activities.

Ruby Fyfee is a junior at Westwood High School. She was nominated by her neighbors, Sandra Horn, Mimi O'Shea and Dr. Gregory and Lorraine Randolph. Ruby served as a legislative intern at the Massachusetts State House, where she advocated and assisted in presenting a bill to the legislature. The recently passed bill (H.4202 Act) assists in making Epi Pens more affordable to those in need. In Mimi O'Shea's nomination of Ruby she remarked, "What makes Ruby stand out is her true dedication to the community and her sense of responsibility to speak up and take action... she leads by example." Ruby is a competitive swimmer and is CPR and lifeguard certified. At Westwood High School, Ruby is involved with the Model UN, Mock Trial, and Legislative Council. She also serves as a volunteer for Westwood Youth & Family Services, as part of *Teen Scene* @ *the Library*, a joint program with the Westwood Library.

Pragna Lal is a fourth grader at Hanlon Elementary School. Pragna was nominated by her third grade teacher, Mr. Jeremy Wolfe. In his nomination he noted, "Pragna is an exceptional 8 year old with big dreams and the drive to see her dreams come through. She was responsible for creating a Friendship Week at Hanlon, which culminated in a series of activities about being a good friend and how to make friends with others." She was inspired to take action and make a difference after she and her family attended a March For Your Lives Rally in Boston. In an interview with Wicked Local-Westwood, Pragna stated, "Just because you are different, doesn't mean you can't be friends."

Roisin O'Keeffe graduated this summer from Westwood High. She was nominated for the award by Pauline and Tessa Scolaro. Roisin has dedicated herself to a number of groups and causes. She is a member of the Venture Scouts and the Westwood Girl Scouts, where she is working towards her Gold Award. At Westwood High School she managed the first DNAC club which worked to bring awareness of international issues to high school students. She was a member of the Chess Club, Mock Trial and the National Honor Society. She volunteered with a number of WY&FS mentor programs including Bullying Prevention Theater and Body Safety Theater.

At the ceremony, the honorees will be celebrated for their accomplishments with their families and those that nominated them.

The load was on fire in the back of the vehicle and the entire load had to be emptied onto the Council On Age parking lot. The fire department was deployed to put out the fire, an open topped dumpster was then needed for clean up and much damaged was caused to the newly paved parking lot.
