

Director's Report – Tricia Perry Westwood Public Library 8 February 2021

Staffing / Recruiting Update

Library Director

Joan Courtney Murray and Linda Unger reported that the Library Director job posting was posted on Mon. Feb. 1 as planned. So far, there are 13 applicants. A "Search Committee" will be established, which will include Joan Courney Murray, Paul Fitzgerald, and Mary Beth Persons, with staff and community representation as well. At the January 25th Meeting of the Trustees, the group discussed having a listening session with Paul, Chris, Joan and the library team to hear their thoughts on what they would like to see in the next Director. Due to extenuating circumstances, this has not yet occurred, but Joan and committee will be scheduling that in the next week or so.

Head of Adult Services

We first advertised this position in mid-October, with 39 applicants. In early November, a candidate was identified for a final interview with the Town Administrator and Head of Human Resources, That process was completed, but the selected applicant withdrew after their final interview. In light of the importance of this position and focusing on the needs of the community and the institution, the search committee was unanimous in its decision to re-post the position.

The reposting occurred on January 14th, and there were 10 new applicants, with several highly qualified applicants. At this time, Interviews have been held via Zoom and in-person for candidates that have moved forward in the process. Lizzy and I will be verifying references, and hope to put forward a recommendation to the Town Administrator and Head of Human Resources of a candidate for a final interview early this week.

Reference Librarian

The position posting remains active, with 63 applications received to date for the position of Adult Services / Reference Librarian. At this time, several candidates have been identified for a preliminary Zoom interview process. In-person interviews will be held onsite with applicants who proceed to the next interview phase, which will include a "mock reference interview" as well as a book talk. The interview team will include Library Department Heads as well as Teen Librarian, Felicia O'Keefe.

Budget:

The FY22 budget process is underway, and the FY22 Municipal Budget Book will be presented to the Finance Committee tomorrow evening (February 9th). Following that, I anticipate that we will be scheduled to meet with the members of the Finance Committee Municipal Subcommittee. That

meeting date has not yet been established. In the next few weeks, Lizzy and I will be working together to review materials and status of both FY21 and FY22 budgets so that she will be thoroughly familiar with the process and the data.

Islington Branch Library

Weekly progress and review meetings with architect (Mike McKay), Tower Construction, OPM Arcadis staff and Town Administration and other departments continue. Framing and sheathing are continuing for the next several weeks. As discussed at the January 25th meeting of the Trustees, we have reached out to Tucker Library Interiors to set up a meeting to discuss stacks and shelving layouts in specific detail. At this time, a decision has been made for the selection of carpeting color (grey vs. tan – group went with the gray!). Weekly progress continues to be chronicled by Karen Cagen, unofficial Library Photographer! WESTWOOD HISTORICAL SOCIETY- A Legacy of Colonialism via Literature from Those in Exile Tuesday, March 9, 2021 @ 7:30 PM via Zoom

The Westwood Historical Society – in collaboration with the Westwood Public Library – will be hosting Dr. Nancy Milner Kelly as our speaker. During this program, Nancy will provide a brief overview of colonialism as background. She will then talk about the works of novelists and a poet who have

relocated from Asia and Latin America as well as Africa and Caribbean countries. Images and themes of geographical, cultural, emotional, and linguistic exile are prevalent in this literature. However, these writers also talk about the solace they seek (and receive) in writing, with writing becoming a new kind of "homeland" for them. Frequently, they write in the language of their new country, partly to ensure a wider audience. Nancy will also use paintings, photos, and quotes from some of these post-colonial novels and poems to illustrate how these themes play out in the written word.
