Writes legibly and correctly forms uppercase and lowercase letters.				
In all grades, students learn to represent and solve real-world problems; make mathematical arguments; use tools or visual models to show mathematical relationships; recognize mathematical patterns; and reason strategically. <b>* Focus areas for students in kindergarten are listed below:</b> Knows number names and the count sequence to 100. Accurately counts up to 20 objects, connecting number to quantity. Recognizes, names, and writes numerals 0–20. Compares numbers or groups of items up to 10 (greater, more, fewer, one less, one more, etc.) Uses objects, drawings, or numerals to add and subtract with numbers up to 10. Fluently adds and subtracts within 5, including 0. Composes and decomposes numbers from 11 to 19 into tens and ones.
