Facilities Update

The new chiller for the main library was ordered in January but due to supply chain issues, will not be delivered until August 4th. Jimmy McCarthy and his team have come up with a plan to rent a chiller for the months of June and July so there will not be interruption to service. This will work the same as last summer and take over parking spaces in the back parking lot for the duration of its use.

Funding for repairs to the paving, curbing, and parking lot was approved at town meeting on May 2nd. There is not yet a date in place for when this work will be done but I have been assured by Facilities Director Jimmy McCarthy that they will try to schedule this work to limit the interruption of library services as much as possible.
