Executive Session Script

See G.L. c.30A, § 21(a)(7). Pursuant to G.L. c.30A §22(f) (g) to comply with any general law for review of Executive Session Minutes, all of which would have a detrimental effect on the position of the governing body if the discussion were in open session.

The Board will not return to open session.
