


Westwood GHG Emissions

Municipal facilities and activities were 3% of total emissions.

MAJORITY of town's emissions **92.4%** come from:

- Residential Buildings 35%
- 2. Passenger Vehicles 32.1%
- 3. Commercial/Industrial 25.3%

- Promote an equitable, clean & healthy community.






Proposed Goals
