Director/Staff report:

- a) Summer Stats
 - a. Expenses grew at same rate as revenue
 - b. Volleyball and lacrosse sports did not run this summer which led to decrease in sports enrollment
 - c. Scholarship money is funded via Community Chest and Westwood Rec dept
- b) Winter Programs
 - a. Brochure
 - i. Submitted to the printer on Friday November 17
 - ii. Will be mailed in approximately 2 weeks
 - iii. Recreation office now opens at 9am to align better with programming
 - iv. Two new inclusive programs: The Underground and Inclusive West Wood Derby
 - b. Registration
 - i. Residents December 7 @ 12pm
 - ii. Non-Residents December 8 @ 12pm

- c. Deerfield Space
 - i. Westwood Recreation has permission to run programming 2nd half of winter (mid-February June).
 - ii. Programming will most likely require parent drop offs
- c) Winter Swim Team
 - a. Numbers have increased
 - i. Over 200 swimmers
 - b. Need for high school students to stay and be a role model for younger swimmers
- d) Fields/Facilities
 - a. Pickleball
 - i. Continue to look for space to fit three pickleball courts
 - ii. Rich has sent a list of options to Chris Coleman to share with Select Board
 - iii. Rich added funding for the court to the town's Capital Improvement Plan
 - iv. Sheehan
 - 1. Town doesn't want to build courts that might possibly get torn down if Sheehan is rebuilt
 - v. C.O.A./Thurston
 - 1. On school land
 - 2. Thurston will need rehab work. Town prefers to not build near a school that needs rehab
 - 3. Safety of a court that close to the baseball field
 - vi. Land behind softball fields
 - 1. Too close to gas lines
 - vii. Sand volleyball court by high school
 - 1. On school land
 - 2. Parking tight
 - 3. Has the most potential
 - viii. Land near Deerfield
 - 1. Unclear on the future of Deerfield
 - ix. First Parish lot
 - 1. Land would need to be cleared
 - 2. Most expensive option
 - x. Pending engineering evaluation, the Westwood Recreation Board recommends that we install a pickleball court at the sand volleyball court located at the Westwood High School
 - 1. Mitch Katzman moved to make the recommendation, Kyle Piche seconded. Unanimously passed, no nays.
