FREE DENTAL SCREENING Saturday, April 10 9:00am to 1:00pm

A free dental screening clinic for seniors will be held at the Westwood Council on Aging. Dentists will examine patients for problems with their teeth, gums, and dentures. Patients can ask dentists questions and discuss their concerns. Participants will also be screened for oral cancers and free denture cleaning will be provided through Massasoit Community College's Dental Assistant program. During the screening clinic, participants can apply to be part of the Elder Dental Program, which provides reduced-fee dental services to low-income seniors. Area residents age 60 or older whose annual incomes are less than \$27,000 may qualify for this program.

A nutritionist from HESSCO Elder Services will talk with participants about the role of nutrition in oral health and will give advice to those with chewing problems, dry mouth, medication interactions, and other concerns.

MODIFIED "MY PYRAMID" FOR OLDER ADULTS

Older Adults to correspond with the new USDA food pyramid, now known as *MyPyramid*. The Tufts version is specifically designed for older adults and has changed in appearance and content. The Modified MyPyramid for Older Adults continues to emphasize nutrient-dense food choices and the importance of fluid balance, but has added additional guidance about forms of foods that could best meet the unique needs of older adults and about the importance of regular physical activity.

"Adults over the age of 70 have unique dietary needs," says first author Alice H. Lichtenstein, D.Sc., director of the Cardiovascular Nutrition Laboratory at the Jean Mayer USDA Human Nutrition Research Center on Aging at Tufts (USDA HNRCA). "Older adults tend to need fewer calories as they age because they are not as physically active as they once were and their metabolic rates slow

down. Nevertheless, their bodies still require the same or higher levels of nutrients for optimal health outcomes. The Modified MyPyramid for Older Adults is intended to be used for general guidance in print form or as a supplement to the *MyPyramid* computer-based program."
