Please feel free to submit your questions anonymously by dropping them in the *Ask A Lawyer* box located at the Senior Center.

This month's question is:

Q: My neighbor says my power of attorney cannot be used after I die. Is this correct?

A: Yes, your neighbor is correct. A power of attorney is a document you create that appoints a person (your "agent" or "attorney-in-fact") to act on your behalf, usually to handle financial matters. Powers of attorney are generally intended to be used if you are incapacitated and unable to handle these matters yourself. A power of attorney terminates when the person who creates the document dies, and the attorney-in-fact named in the document has no further authority to act on behalf of the deceased person. After a person's death, the Executor of his Will (or the Administrator of his estate if he died without a Will) after appointment by the Court is the only person who has authority to act on behalf of the deceased person or to handle assets owned by the deceased person, unless assets are held in trust.



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
