HEARING:

The Board of Appeals for the Town of Westwood held a Public Hearing according to the General Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts on Wednesday, February 15 at 7:00 PM in the Champagne Meeting Room of the Carby Street Municipal Office Building, 50 Carby Street, Westwood, MA 02090 to consider the Petitioners' request for a Special Permit pursuant to Section 4.3.3.2 of the Westwood Zoning Bylaws, entitled Accessory Uses in Residential Districts, in order to construct a private garage at a single family residence to store or park four (4) motor vehicles. Property located within the Single Residential District C (SRC).

APPLICABLE SECTION OF THE WESTWOOD ZONING BYLAW

4.3 ACCESSORY USES

4.3.1 **Table of Accessory Uses.** The Table of Accessory Uses designates which Accessory Uses are allowed in each zoning district.

A Use is permitted by right in any district under which it is denoted by the letter "Y".

A Use is prohibited in any district under which it is denoted by the letter "N".

A Use may be permitted by special permit from the Board of Appeals in any district under which is denoted by the letters "BA".

A Use may be permitted by special permit from the Planning Board in any district under which is denoted by the letters "PB".

DISTRICTS

4.4 NOTES FOR TABLE OF ACCESSORY USES

- Provided that any such uses shall be conducted primarily for the convenience of employees and the clientele of the principal use of the premises and shall be wholly within a building and have no exterior advertising display.
- The total square feet of floor space within a parking garage as an accessory use shall not be included in the calculation of Floor Area Ratio.

FINDINGS

In consideration of all of the testimony and exhibits and documents submitted before the Board, the Board makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. The Petitioner is proposing to build a new single family home that contains a four (4) bay private garage. Since this structure will have the ability to park and/or store more than three (3) motor vehicles, the project will require a Special Permit pursuant to Section 4.3.3.2. The Board of Appeals is the Special Permit granting authority.
- 2. The property encompasses 4.66 acres, and the proposed building coverage will approximate 6400 square feet. The proposed structure does not encroach on any setbacks.
- 3. Two garage bays will be screened behind the house so that the doors are not visible from the property's frontage. The second two garage bays are located in a separate structure closer to the rear of the property and obstructed from street view by a port-cochere.
- 4. There will be four exterior garage doors with enough interior space to contain more than three vehicles.
- 5. The use of the vehicles will be consistent with that of a residential setting, for personal use by the occupants of the home.
- 6. Any adverse effects of the Petitioner's proposed construction will not outweigh its beneficial impact to the Town, or the neighborhood, in view of the particular characteristics of the site and the proposal in relation to that site.
- 7. The Petitioner's proposed construction will not have a material adverse effect on the value of the land and buildings in the neighborhood, or on the amenities thereof, or be detrimental to the normal use of the adjacent property, and it will not be injurious or dangerous to the public health or hazardous because of traffic congestion, or other reason, and any adverse effects of the proposed use do not outweigh its beneficial aspects, all in view of the particular characteristics of the site and of the proposal in relation to that site.
- 8. The Petitioner has met all the requirements for a Special Permit pursuant to the Westwood Zoning Bylaw.

DECISION and CONDITIONS

The Board of Appeals voted unanimously to grant the Petitioner's request for a Special Permit pursuant to Section 4.3.3.2 of the Westwood Zoning Bylaw and upon the following conditions:

- 1. The Project shall be constructed in conformity with the submitted plan consisting of eighteen (18) pages, prepared by Innovative Collaborations, Inc., 369 Congress Street, dated 12/16/2016 and the submitted plot plan prepared by Robert Jordan Buckley, Beals & Thomas Inc., 144 Turnpike Rd, Southborough, MA 01772, dated December 13, 2016. The Applicant shall pursue completion of the Project with reasonable diligence and continuity.
- 2. This Special Permit shall not take effect until a copy of the Decision, bearing the certification of the Town Clerk that twenty (20) days have elapsed after the filing of the decision and either that no appeal has been filed or that an appeal has been filed within such time period, is recorded in the Registry of Deeds and indexed under the name of the property owner of record and the parcel address. A copy of these recordings shall be provided to the Building Commissioner, Town Clerk and the Board of Appeals.

- 3. The person exercising rights under a duly appealed special permit does so at risk that a court will reverse the permit and any construction performed under the permit may be ordered to be undone.
- 4. This Special Permit shall lapse within a specified period of time, of not more than two (2) years, which shall not include such time required to pursue or await the determination of the appeal referred to in Chapter 40A, Section 17, from the grant thereof, if a substantial use thereof has not sooner commenced except for good cause or, in the case of a permit for construction, if construction has not begun by such date except for good cause. Prior to the expiration of the Special Permit, the Applicant may apply for an extension of the Special Permit for a period not to exceed one (1) year if the substantial construction or use thereof has not commenced for good cause.
